If you are vocationally inclined to volunteer to encourage expectant and teen parents in high school to succeed as a productive member of our community, opportunities to do so now exist in the Montebello (MUSD) and Rowland (RUSD) Unified School Districts under a cooperative program with Buenanueva Foundation, Inc.

PREVENTION BASED MENTORING

The goal of **PBMP** is to promote the positive development of youth through one-on-one mentorship involving the active programmatic engagement of young people, their families, their school, and the broader community - **Mentors**. The program is supported by a series of campus-held workshops and activities such as *Creative Parenting, Seeking a College Education, Financial Aid, Self-esteem, Healthy Relationships, College Prep for Grandparents, and Mother's Day*. **Mentors** are welcome to participate during the workshops and activities. Buenanueva's current focus is to support primary and secondary adolescent pregnancy programs through cooperative working relationships. Young people receive basic moral and financial support necessary to adopt a healthy life style to continue their education well beyond the high school diploma.

- Possess organizational and problem solving skills,
- Motivate and serve as a role model,
- Assist in setting educational goals and provide academic support,
- Monitor and record student's progress, and
- Carry a genuine desire to making a difference in the life of the **Mentee**.
